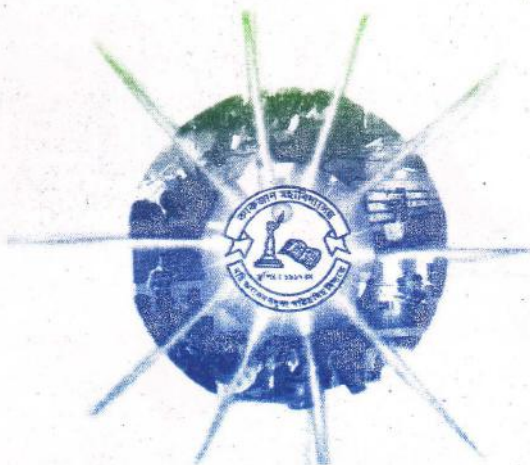

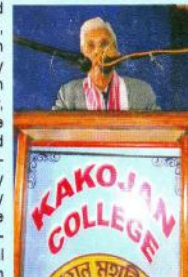
DULAL CHANDRA KHOUND MEMORIAL LECTURE

Social Service Programme

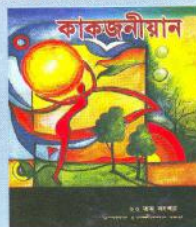
